For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. ¹⁸And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. ¹⁹I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." ²⁰Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

Praise to You, O Christ

Sermon

People of God, grace to you and peace from God, and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. AMEN.

For the better part of the 12 weeks that we've been in this process, we have heard call narratives and sermons about God calling us into the uncomfortable places. Seemingly each and every one of the narratives that we have read has pointed to God calling us into the places that we would rather not go to. But they've all stopped short of showing us what happens when we do.

We've allowed ourselves to think of our reasons why not. We've imagined the things we've told ourselves that have kept us from fully living into that which God calls us to, and the rah rah sermons have been there. And so has the hesitancy.

With each of those messages I've had my own thoughts of "is this actually what we are going to do? Do I, as the Pastor, actually want to be a part of this? Will it work? Is it worth it?"

These are questions that I have asked. Perhaps I am not alone. And I think it's okay to ask those questions. After all, we are human. It is human nature to second guess a really good plan. We do it all the time. AND, the stories that we've heard that encourage us to do those things, haven't always told us how it will actually go.

But we are reminded of those themes that we heard in the beginning of this process. God is at the center of all that we do. We will continue to keep it that way. We will remind ourselves that this is nothing that we are doing on our own, rather it is God working through us in the world.

And, when we remember those things it does us good to get back to thinking about those places that we've told ourselves we can't go and those Big Hairy Audacious Goals we've told ourselves we can't accomplish.

Thankfully, our call narrative for today shows us what DOES happen when we allow ourselves to actually pursue those things we've always told ourselves we can't.

Peter. One of the Apostle's. The Rock. The one on whom Christ will build the church, finds himself in Joppa. At this point in his life he is still clinging to those things that he has told himself to be true and the way things ought to be. In his mind God is still a God of division and who can and can't.

While in Joppa he has a vision. A large sheet is coming down from heaven and is coming close to him. As he looks closely he sees four footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. And there is a voice, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat."

Peter, again clinging to that which he knows to be true abiding by the way things ought to be, refuses. "I cannot. Nothing profane or unclean must enter my mouth."

A second time the voice calls, saying, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane."

Three times this happened. Finally the vision ends and there are three men from Caesarea and the Spirit guides Peter to go with them. The Spirit encourages him to pay no attention to the distinctions that he might have been himself and them. Remember, Peter is clinging to that which he knows to be true and the way things ought to be.

Upon entering a man's house he hears that an Angel had appeared to the man and told him to send for Peter. The man, whom Peter would consider to be outside of the boundary that he is to cross, who goes against all that Peter knows to be true and against the way things ought to be, tells him that Peter is to give a message by which he and the entire household will be saved.

In their conversation the Holy Spirit fell upon him just as it had fallen upon the believers who were there at the beginning. And it is in that moment that Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

He then has a realization that I think ought to be plastered at every exit of every church for people to see as they are about to go out into the mission field that is the world around us: "If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?"

How often do we get in God's way with the excuses we make for why we can't do what we believe God is calling us to do?

This who story, the sharing of the experience that he had, is in response to the question he received regarding why he ate with those that he was not to eat with. Those who were different. Those who were on the other side of the boundary that they had set up. In response to there questions he gives them his experience.

"When they heard this, they were silenced."

What follows could have gone one of many directions. They could have been angry. They could have laughed him out of the room. He could have been banished. Instead...

"They praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

When those who questioned Peter's ministry heard the stories of God's action in it, their excuses ended.

They praised God for reaching across the boundaries they had set up and realized the life giving love of God in Christ Jesus is for all people.

Putting aside all that they knew to be true and what they knew of how things ought to be, they were no longer a hindrance to God's activity in the world.

People of God, this is the message we need to hear. It is no longer a wondering about how things might go if we dare ourselves to be uncomfortable and challenged by the Gospel. This story shows us what will happen when we loose the bonds that we have placed on the Good News of God's Love for God's People.

If God has given the same gift of the Holy Spirit to those whom we encounter, that we ourselves have received in believing in Christ, then who are we that we could hinder God?
