In Isaiah the one God who sits above the earth and numbers the stars also strengthens the powerless. So in Jesus' healing work we see the hand of the creator God, lifting up the sick woman to health and service (*diakonia*). Like Simon's mother-in-law, we are lifted up and healed to serve. Following Jesus, we strengthen the powerless; like Jesus, we seek to renew our own strength in quiet times of prayer.

The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ**

Sermon

People of God, grace to you and peace from God, and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. AMEN

When is the last time you told yourself, "I don't need to do another task right now. What I've accomplished is good for now." ??

Can you think of it? How many of you had that happen just yesterday? How about a week ago? Last month? Don't remember the last time you said that?

Okay.

Now, think about a place that you would go to completely get away. And, it can be to get away from anything. But, if you know your body and the cues it gives you, think of the place that you go when your body tells you, "we need to get away for a while."

Have you got that place in mind? I'll give you a moment.....

Got it? Good. When is the last time your body our mind told you that you needed to go there? Yesterday? Last week? Last month? Can't remember?

Got it? Good. NOW, when your body or mind last told you that you needed to go to whatever that place for you is, did you listen?

Our Gospel text for today shows us the importance of getting the rest we need to be the servants of Christ that we are created to be.

Jesus and his disciples walk into Simon and Andrew's home and Simon Peter's mother-in-law is sick in bed. Her body literally told her, "you are sick, you need to lay down." She was not well. Like any good son-in-law would do, Simon Peter brings her Jesus. And, she is made well.

Immediately she gets out of bed and begins to serve. There are many ways that folks can look at this. Some look at this and want to point to the gender roles at play. The men are going to sit and talk and woman of the house is going to serve them. And, while that seems the obvious situation at play, it isn't necessarily the case. Simon's mother-in-law is created to serve. She knows that. Serving is what she knows. Therefore, serving is what she does.

But she needed rest first.

After a day full of fellowship, at sunset, many were brought to him, not just many ALL, who were possessed with demons. Again, remembering the texts of the past few weeks, Jesus has been casting out demons like Oprah giving away gifts. And again, ALL who were possessed with demons were brought to him to be made well. "THE WHOLE CITY WAS GATHERED AROUND THE DOOR." And, many were cured of their illnesses, and many demons were cast out.

The next morning, while it was still dark. Jesus went to that place in his mind that he goes to when his body and mind tells him that he needs to get away.

Jesus knew what he needed to do to refresh his body, mind, and spirit, AND HE DID IT!

We so often ask ourselves the WWJD question. What Would Jesus Do?

However, when we ask ourselves that question we often tell ourselves that Jesus would go onto the next mission because there is more work to be done and more sickness to be healed and more demons to be cast out. Therefore, I need to go out and find the next mission, heal the next sick person, cast out a cities worth of demons, because that is what Jesus would do.

But, what if we didn't look at the big grand things that Jesus did. What if we started with the little things. If we look at the last three weeks of Gospel texts, we see a glimpse of the little things that Jesus does, that are often overshadowed by the big grand gestures that he also does.

Calling the fishermen from the shore of the Sea of Galilee. The big thing is that he calls them out of their boats and they immediately leave everything they know and follow him to "fish for people." The little thing? He saw people with gifts that he could use and he lifted them up and called them.

Last week. In the synagogue while preaching and teaching, Jesus is approached by a man with an unclean spirit. The big thing? He heals him. He makes him well. He casts out the demon. The little thing? He gives him the time of day. Something the rest of society refused to do.

This week. The big thing? With the whole city gathered at his door, Jesus heals many illnesses and casts out many demons. The little thing? He goes afterwards to find some time alone. To refresh. To be well again.

Now, when was the last time you told somebody to do something and they did it immediately? How about the last time you healed the sick? Cast out demons?

My guess is you've maybe never done it, or at least not that frequently.

But, when was the last time you saw the gifts that someone has and lifted them up? How about gave someone the time of day that nobody else would? Or, went away to give yourself the time you need to be made whole?

We see the importance of listening to our bodies and doing the things we need to do. And, more importantly Jesus shows us that it can be done!

Yes, we do it to be refreshed to be the servant that God has made us to be, but we aren't our best when we fail to recognize that God may very well want us to take a nap.
