But, with Jesus, that is not the case. Jesus invites us to examine our own shame, and the shame we may prescribe to others, and experience the fullness of God's grace and mercy.

#### Holy Gospel according to Saint John 4:7-15

<sup>7</sup> A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." <sup>8</sup> (His disciples had gone to the city to buy food.) <sup>9</sup> The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?" (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.) <sup>[a]</sup> <sup>10</sup> Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." <sup>11</sup> The woman said to him, "Sir, <sup>[b]</sup> you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? <sup>12</sup> Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us the well and with his sons and his flocks drank from it?" <sup>13</sup> Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, <sup>14</sup> but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." <sup>15</sup> The woman said to him, "Sir, <sup>[c]</sup> give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water."

## Praise to You, O Christ

#### Sermon

People of God, grace to you and peace from God, and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. AMEN

To set the scene for this Gospel text, right before this in John 14:15 it tells us that Jesus has been on a long journey, he's gone through Samaria, he is tired, and he comes to Jacob's well, and takes a seat by the well.

It was about noon.

That little fact is rather important in the grand scheme of this story.

Noon would have been the hottest time of the day. This woman, of Samaria, came to the well at this time because she assumed that no one else would be there at this time, because quite frankly it made no sense to carry one's water jugs with the temperatures what they would have been. So, it was on purpose that she comes to the well at noon. She hoped that nobody would be there.

Why? Because she carried much shame with her. Imagine the surprise when she, a Samaritan woman, encounters Jesus, a Jewish man.

Immediately we are introduced to a couple of different levels of inherent shame that she is bringing to the well with her. She is a woman and Jesus is a man. She is a Samaritan and he is Jewish. And she knows they shouldn't be talking! Jesus asks for a drink and her response is, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria.

She expected, with the inherent levels of shame at play, that he would shun her and tell her that she has no place at this well while he is there. Because of what society has told her she assumes that this Jewish man would not give her the time of day, and it is true, Jesus had every right, and perhaps even the expectation, to cast her aside.

But he doesn't. Instead Jesus gives her the time and a place to be simply who she is. Furthermore, he engages in conversation with her. Because he hasn't cast her aside, shunned her, told her that she can't be there talking with him, Jesus invites her out of her shame and gives her time and a place.

But the story does not stop there! This encounter continues!

<sup>16</sup> Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come back." <sup>17</sup> The woman answered him, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You are right in saying, 'I have no husband,' <sup>18</sup> for you have had five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true!"

They have now exposed even more levels of shame this woman is feeling. Likely this is the shame that she brought with her to the well, at noon, when no one else was there, in the first place. People likely knew her. They likely knew her story. They were most certainly aware of all that Jesus discloses to her. And she didn't want to encounter that. She certainly wasn't expecting to encounter the Messiah either.

But she does. And the Messiah gives her time and a place.

And the conversation continues! Not being turned away she remains and dwells in the presence of the Messiah.

<sup>19</sup> The woman said to him, "Sir, I see that you are a prophet. <sup>20</sup> Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you<sup>[f]</sup> say that the place where people must worship is in Jerusalem." <sup>21</sup> Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. <sup>22</sup>You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. <sup>23</sup> But the hour is coming and is now here when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. <sup>24</sup> God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." <sup>25</sup> The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Christ). "When he comes, he will proclaim all things to us." <sup>26</sup> Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking to you."

Having given her the time and a place he now discloses to her that he is the one she is waiting for. He is the Messiah. The one who is speaking to her.

And then the disciples show up. They were ASTONISHED that he would be speaking to this woman full of shame. Never mind the societal levels of shame that she is a woman...of Samaria, but she has had 5 husbands and the one she is with now is NOT her husband. They cannot believe it.

Meanwhile, having been invited OUT of her shame and given time and a place to dwell in the presence of the Messiah she drops everything that she has and runs back to the city. So again, she has come to the well for a reason. To get water. She drops it and runs back to the city. She had also come to the well, at noon, for a reason. Because the very people who are IN THE CITY THAT SHE IS RUNNING BACK TO wouldn't have been there. Because of her shame, she didn't want to see them.

BUT, because the Messiah invited her OUT of her shame, she cannot wait to tell the very people she didn't want to see all about this JEWISH man that she has encountered.

This woman left everything that she had brough with her to retrieve her water and RAN to the city freed of shame and tells of the goodness of God's grace and mercy and the very people she wanted to avoid, who knew her story, LISTENED TO HER!

People of God, what is that shame that you are carrying with you today? What is that shame that you hope no one would ever find out about? What is that shame that you could never imagine the Messiah disclosing to you?

It is that shame that the Messiah invites you out of and into the goodness of God's grace and mercy.

It is that shame that the Messiah casts aside instead of casting you aside.

It is that shame that the Messiah invites YOU out of to run to the very people that know everything that you want to keep hidden, to share what you know of the goodness of God's grace and mercy.

Thanks be to God. AMEN
